

2025 Border City Bassmasters (BCB)

Official Rules & Regulations

Walleye Open April 12, 2025

1. ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICIAL RULES & SAFETY REGULATIONS:

The following rules and safety regulations will remain unchanged for the year indicated above, except for special tournaments. Any incidents observed during the tournament event should be reported to Tournament Officials for investigation immediately. Interpretation and enforcement of these rules shall be left exclusively to Tournament Officials.

2. TOURNAMNET OFFICIALS:

Tournament Officials shall be comprised of the designated BCB Tournament Director and Tournament Committee members only. In the event of a rule violation or protest, only Tournament Officials may impose such sanctions, as deemed appropriate including, without limitation, fines, forfeiture of prizes, disqualification and prohibition from participation in future events. Official's decisions shall be final in all matters and will not be subject to appeal. For further information regarding rules violations and protest, refer to Section 24.

3. SPORTSMANSHIP AND CONDUCT:

Any violation of the basic principles addressed in this document may be deemed cause for disqualification, penalties and/or further sanctions. Participants in any BCB event will conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike, courteous, safe, and ethical manner while always maintaining a professional demeanor towards the general public, fellow competitors and in all interaction/communication with Tournament Officials and Volunteers at all times.

Maximum courtesy and sportsmanship must be practiced at all times. Any efforts that do not promote sportsmanship, clean waters and conservation in any manner are grounds for immediate disqualification and may include further sanctions.

Any unfavorable conduct or speech during public interaction, text or other messaging, phone calls or all media formats (includes social media), etc. by a BCB participant that reflects unfavorably on the BCB, its participants, tournament officials and sponsors at any time will be cause for immediate disqualification and may include further sanctions. Tournament Officials will have final say in all rulings regarding sportsmanship violations and consequences.

4. USE AND/OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL, CANNABIS OR ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Use and/or possession of illegal substances by any participant during the tournament event & hours will not be tolerated. Tournament hours are defined as from the 3:00 PM mandatory off the water time, Friday April 11,2025 3:00pm, until the end of awards ceremony on April 12,2025.. Any evidence of use or possession of illegal substances during this time will result in immediate disqualification.

No usage or possession of alcoholic beverages is permitted and not allowed on tournament boats at any time during tournament competition. Participants are not permitted to have alcohol in their possession until they have weighed their daily catch, retrieved their official weigh slip, and returned their boat to the trailer or boat slip. If a

tournament venue has further restrictions regarding alcohol use, the BCB will abide by whichever rule is more restrictive. Violation of this rule will result in loss of weigh in and/or disqualification as deemed necessary by Tournament Officials.

Use of cannabis, in any form (including medicinal), is not permitted during tournament hours or at any tournament event, including, but not limited to, the Captains meeting, tournament days, weigh in area or any other area deemed to be a tournament venue. Any evidence of use of cannabis during this time will result in immediate disqualification.

5. PARTICIPATION & ELIGIBILITY:

Upon sign up, it is all the participants responsibility for knowing and abiding by all BCB rules, Provincial/State and Local boating, and fishing regulations for all the designated tournament waters. Any change, exception, or addition to the BCB rules as determined necessary by the Tournament Director and/or Committee, will be communicated as soon as possible and be covered prior to the 1st competition day of the tournament.

The BCB Walleye Open is an open event to members and non-members of the Border City Bassmasters fishing club. All other events including the Walleye Twilight Series, the Bass Twilight Series and the Bass Full Day Series including the Championship are restricted to active members in good standing of the Border City Bassmasters (BCB). All memberships expire on December 31 each calendar year. Memberships are nontransferable and non-refundable.

Any person under the age of 18 must have the signature of a parent or legal guardian on the liability release. No persons under age 12 may participate without explicit BCB Committee approval and must have a parent or legal guardian present during all tournament events.

Teams may enter up to two participants (anglers) per team and no "partner TBD" or unknown partner names are allowed. Any use of TBD or unknown will be considered a blank entry.

Eligible partner changes are permitted until the close of on-site registration and only up to 24 hours before the designated blast-off time. Any team/partner change requests after that time will only be considered on an emergency basis as determined by the Tournament Director. Each team must complete, sign, and submit an official entry form with payment online by the due dates. The BCB Executive and BCB Tournament Committee reserve the right to refuse participation, (including championship/special events), to anyone for any reason including, but not limited to, suspension, disqualification or banning from this or other events, criminal behavior, violation of game laws, or any unsportsmanlike behavior at any time (See Section 3 & 28) that would reflect dishonorably on our sport.

6. SAFETY

All boats must be equipped with wheel or tiller steering; no other steering device will be permitted. No cumbersome non-fishing vessel/craft will be permitted. Any boat deemed not capable of safe usage on tournament waters will not be permitted as determined by Tournament Officials.

During any "official" tournament day, no participant or team may use a boat unless they have documented proof of boating liability coverage in reasonable amounts on that boat. Proof of insurance must be always with the boat and available upon request by Tournament Director. Random checks may be conducted at events.

Safe boating conduct must be always conducted and observed by all participants.

Participants must always abide by all local navigation laws and avoid restricted areas.

All participants are required and agree to wear a Coast Guard-approved CHEST TYPE personal floatation device anytime the boat is above trolling speed.

Tournament Officials may restrict tournament waters and reserve the right to delay or cancel the start of an official tournament day because of inclement weather or other factors that would endanger the safety of the participants. In the event of a delayed start, additional time may or may not be added in order to extend the day. Decision to extend day or add an additional day of competition (E.g. blow day) will be the sole discretion of the Tournament Director and/or Officials.

In the event of lightning, severe weather or any unsafe condition participants should remove themselves from competition and seek safety or shelter until it is safe to continue. Participants may not leave their boats during tournament hours except in case of emergency.

All teams are required to have two (2) participants on a boat to compete. In the event of an emergency, unforeseen circumstance, or Committee decision that only one registered participant is available for a boat, the Tournament Director will try to assist designating a spotter for the boat. It is the team participants responsibility to avoid this circumstance to best of their ability. If a spotter is designated, this is only for safety reasons and the spotter is not able to fish or help in any fishing activity. If a spotter cannot be located, the team will not be permitted to participate in the event.

All BCB tournaments will have published days of competition, unless delayed, or shortened due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Any boundaries or restricted zones will be announced prior to the first tournament day and may be further altered if needed.

In case of any emergency, please contact authorities first (e.g., Canadian/U.S Coast Guard, EMS, Police etc.) and then contact the BCB Tournament Director when it is safe to do so. In the case of a non-emergency boating situation (E.g., engine/boat malfunction, etc.) that requires you to return early or moor boat in a location other than the designated tournament location, contact the Tournament Director.

7. BOAT, MOTOR & SAFETY EQUIPMENT:

All tournament boats are required to have in their possession all Coast Guard required safety equipment, including but not limited to approved personal flotation devices, a type IV throw cushion, fire extinguisher, distress horn/flag/whistle, and display a boat marker (supplied by BCB). Great Lakes, U.S border and some other waters tournaments require flares and it is the participants responsibility to understand acceptable types for waters being used.

Tournament boats are required to have a functioning bilge pump. Each boat must have a U.S./Canadian Coast Guard rating plate attached to the boat by the manufacturer if required. The horsepower rating of the outboard engine must not exceed the rating specified on this plate. Changing or altering standard factory motor parts to increase horsepower over factory rated horsepower is forbidden. Any modifications made to the boat and or equipment that violates U.S./Canadian Coast Guard regulations for that vessel will result in disqualification.

Any auxiliary fuel tanks on board must be a Coast Guard approved and marine approved tank and not be used as the main fuel supply. (E.g. spare tank for auxiliary trolling motor is permitted) All boats are required to have an engine cut-off switch (ECOS) that IMMEDIATELY shuts off the main engine when pulled. This ECOS MUST have engine cut-off switch link (ECOSL) and be attached to the driver anytime the main engine is in operation. A ECOSL is typically a coiled lanyard but may also be an electronic fob serving the same purpose.

8. TACKLE, EQUIPMENT & REGULATIONS:

Participants must possess all necessary fishing licenses and commit to following all State, Provincial and Local fishing regulations. Any additional regulations (E.g., reduced possession limit, etc.) deemed necessary by the BCB to assure even competition will be specified prior to the tournament day.

All angling must be done from the boat. Participants are not permitted to leave the boat for any reason regarding the act of fishing, even if to just complete the actions necessary to land a fish successfully.

**The Walleye Open April 12, 2025 event is JIGGING, HANDLING OR TROLLING.
ONLY ONE LINE AT A TIME MAY BE USED.**

9. REGISTRATION & ENTRY:

When registration opens online, you may enter the Walleye Open event. Entry fee is \$200 per team unless otherwise noted at time of registration. Entry deadline is close of business (5:00 PM EST) on MONDAY prior to the event. Online entry registration at bordercitybassmasters.ca is the only way to enter a BCB event. Entries will be accepted based on a first-come, first-served basis until the tournament is deemed full (based on date and time stamp when received at BCB website/office). Once you have entered the tournament you will receive an email confirmation and it is the participants responsibility to confirm and retain receipt of entry. All entries must submit payment in full for all tournament fees at the time of application. NO REFUNDS will be made, nor will credit be extended for any cancellations. Disqualification from a tournament for any reason will result in forfeiture of entry fee. No refunds or credits are extended to teams that choose not to fish due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances. If a tournament event is cancelled in its entirety for any reason due to circumstances out of the BCB control, refunds will be issued for entry into that tournament event only.

10. PRE-TOURNAMENT PRACTICE, ONSITE REGISTRATION & COMPETITION:

There are no restrictions on how early a team can pre-fish, unless prohibited by State, Provincial and Local boating and fishing regulations. There are no "official" practice days or off-limits days unless otherwise announced in advance for a specific special event.

On the day of onsite registration and mandatory rules meeting (referred to as "Captains meeting"), you must be "off the water" by 3:00 p.m. "Off the water" is defined as boat is at launching location and in process of being loaded/moored or present on trailer.

During competition, no tournament participant may leave their boat or stop at a location for any reason unless stated allowable in another section of these rules (E.g., emergency). Participants MUST stay in their boat, within indicated tournament waters, at all times, beginning with when their boat is launched post pre-tournament inspection until it has been safely moored at the weigh-in location.

The exchanging or sharing of any equipment once boat is launched post daily inspection will result of loss of weight for the day and/or tournament disqualification per the discretion of the Tournament Director. In the case of emergency equipment considered to be a life saving device or medical assistance, do so first, contact local authorities to initiate support and then contact the Tournament Director.

Once tournament launch has begun (i.e. typically 7:00 AM), stopping at any location to purchase or be provided bait, food, or conduct any other activity not specifically permitted within these rules (Section 16) during tournament hours, whether participants leave the boat or not, is strictly prohibited and cause for immediate disqualification from the event.

11. PERMITTED FISHING LOCATIONS:

The tournament waters for the Walleye Open April 12,2025 will be **Detroit River ONLY**. From the mouth of Lake Erie to the mouth of Lake St. Clair. You may fish US or Canadian waters. Ensure all participating anglers have valid fishing licenses for the water you are fishing. You are responsible to follow all local, provincial and/or state fishing regulations.

12. FISH AND LIMIT INFORMATION:

Walleye, sauger, and saugeye caught on hook and line in a conventional sporting manner (See Section 8) will be accepted. Only legal limits of fish can be kept per boat on each tournament day and only five (5) **ALIVE** fish with a minimum 14" size limit will be utilized for weigh in. Exceeding the tournament catch limit will result in loss of all credit for that day's catch. **ANY UNDER SIZED FISH WILL RESULT IN A 2 LB PENALTY AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BE WEIGH IN.**

Culling of dead fish is strictly prohibited.

The Tournament Officials holds the right to announce and enforce additional and/or more stringent regulations for any event. Any additional specific tournament restrictions, size limits, creel limits and other information will be announced prior to the tournament day.

All fish must be kept in an aerated live-well or cooler. Use of stringers, wire fish baskets, boat bags etc. is prohibited.

Any fish mauled, frozen, on a stringer, injected with water or other material to add weight, showing white gills, soft flesh, sunken eyes, or gills that will not bleed may result in disqualification from the tournament and future BCB events at the discretion of the BCB Tournament Officials.

If an external weight is utilized for the purpose of which is to keep fish alive/upright in the live-well, it should be removed before arriving at the bump tank for weigh in (see Section 20 regarding bump tank). Failure to do so will result in disqualification from the event.

13. TOURNAMENT DAY BOAT INSPECTION & IDENTIFICATION:

A Tournament Official may approach or board your boat at any time for any reason and at any time during the event. Refusal to allow an approved official on board or an effort to impede their work will result in disqualification and further sanctions as deemed necessary.

Each boat **MUST ATTEND** and will be given, prior to each tournament day's start, a livewell, compartment and safety inspection check by a Tournament Official and/or deemed Official Volunteer. During inspection, a boat marker will be provided and, **MUST** remain in or on the boat during tournament hours. The boat marker (E.g. fob w/ number tag) must be turned in during check-in at the bump tanks during the weigh in process.

Failure to return boat marker during weigh in will result in a \$50 cash fine that must be paid before the days catch weigh in will be allowed. Failure to render the fine payment before the final weigh in is completed for the day will result in loss of all weight for that day.

On the water (drive up) inspections are not permitted unless specifically discussed with the Tournament Director. This will be a case-by-case basis and will not be considered for easily trailered vessels.

Boat numbers will be provided prior to the tournament day and must be placed on the

upper cowling on each side of the outboard (or an easily visible location near rear of I/O vessels) prior to blast-off. BCB reserves sole discretion to assign boat numbers in any manner and numbers must always remain on during the entire tournament event. Numbers not placed in an easily visible location and/or blocked from view (E.g. auxiliary engine obstructs view) must be corrected prior to blast-off and no time concessions will be made for teams that have to reposition boat numbers.

The Tournament Director or designated official will launch the boats in a manner and time that will be communicated prior to the tournament day. Failure to be present when your number is announced will result in being moved to the back of line or held until the last boat is released. No additional time nor accommodation will be considered for not being present and ready when boat is called. Leaving and/or taking off before your boat number is announced will result in loss of all weight that tournament day.

In the event of a shortened tournament event due to inclement weather or other circumstance outside the BCB control, the BCB reserves the right to release boats in any manner the Tournament Director and Officials deem appropriate.

14. FISH DISCOVERED IN LIVWELL DURING INSPECTION:

If a BCB fish species (walleye, sauger, saugeye) is found in a boat live-well, cooler, or any other compartment during the pre-launch inspection it will result in disqualification for that day of tournament competition.

15. OFFICIAL CHECK POINT(S):

There shall be an official checkpoint location established for check-out in the morning/ check-in during the afternoon and this point shall be designated prior to the tournament day. At the time of check-out/check-in all competitors and their boats shall be in full compliance with all rules set forth by Tournament Officials and referenced in this document.

At check-in, all boats shall identify themselves to the check-in official and proceed immediately to the designated weigh-in area. It is each team/boats responsibility to know what time they are due in as communicated prior to the tournament day.

Notice: You must check-in with a Tournament Official and return your boat marker even if you don't have any scorable fish. Failure to check in at the end of the day could result in a prohibition from future participation in MWT events.

16. REFUELING:

Boats are permitted to refuel at Provincial/Federal certified marina/harbor fuel stations during competition hours. Participants are not allowed to leave the boat for any reason other than to complete fuel payment transaction (only one participant should conduct payment). No other product(s) shall be purchased during a fuel stop, see Section 10 as required.

17. PURCHASING AND/OR BARTERING FISH INFORMATION:

The purchasing of, or bartering for, information about locating or catching fish on tournament waters, including but not limited to GPS waypoints (other than through commercially available sources) and the hiring of fishing guide services is strictly prohibited during tournament days and 14 days prior to the first tournament event.

18. LATE PENALTY:

Participants who are not at the official safety check-in point as described above at the appointed return time shall **be penalized 1(one) pound per minute. After 15 minutes late they will be not allowed to weigh in resulting in a 0(zero) weight for the team.** This return time will be

noted by the check-in official (timekeeper) at the established area (See Section 15). Obtaining acknowledgement by the check-in official for the purpose of timekeeping is solely the responsibility of the participants. There shall be no excuse for tardiness and in no case will a competitor be allowed to make up "lost time". Return time shall be defined as off-plane, past the check-in official & point and/or acknowledgement by check-in official.

19. TOURNAMENT BOAT BREAKDOWN INSTRUCTIONS:

All participants must remain together, leaving and returning to the official checkpoint by boat. All competitors must always remain in boat except in case of dire emergency if they wish their fish to be counted for the day.

In case of non-emergency event or break down (does not include running out of fuel), in which a team is not able to travel back to the weigh-in site under power, participants should contact the Tournament Director before taking any action.

The only permitted way to return for weigh-in without your own power is:

1.) By being towed in by a boat operated by another tournament competitor in the event or a designated rescue boat. Both boats must arrive by the whichever teams is the earliest designated return time.

2.) By one team member transferring their clearly marked fish to another tournament boat and proceeding directly to the weigh in. This process should include at minimum:

- Recorded or live video footage of entire marking and transfer process
- Both teams' individual fish clearly marked (E.g. in a separate weigh in bag or container, separate live-well with clearly identifiable cull tags)

Locating or flagging down another tournament boat for assistance via phone, messaging, or radio transmission in an effort to link up with a specific team is not allowed. Physically flagging down or an open radio call that was seeking help from any tournament boat in proximity to return to the weigh-in site is allowable. Neither tournament boat/team is permitted to fish after assisting, must proceed directly to weigh in site once boat is moored/trailer and all parties go directly to the Tournament Director.

Arriving late, because of offering or needing assistance due to a non-emergency breakdown, even with the aid of a rescue boat, as the towed boat or the towing boat is still late, and all penalties will apply. No exceptions.

Both parties (the team needing and team lending assistance) should immediately report to the Tournament Director upon arrival at weigh in. Any Team involved in a break down procedure that involves transferring fish between boats, may be polygraphed as necessary (Section 25) at the Tournament Officials sole discretion.

If the Tournament Director cannot be reached in the event of a breakdown, teams should take appropriate action to return boat and team safely to nearest port or the weigh in location. In event the above process cannot be followed, it will result in loss of days catch weight.

20. SCORING AND WEIGH IN:

Only eligible fish will be utilized for the purpose of scoring (See Section 12). Scoring shall be determined by the pound\ounce weight of each team's catch during the tournament. Each team's total weight will determine the final standings.

Teams must provide their own tournament style weigh in bag to transport fish to the bump tanks. Coolers, hand carrying, waste bags, etc. are not permitted to be used.

The weigh in process will begin with transportation of the fish from the boat utilizing a tournament style weigh in bag to the bump tanks near the weigh in. The bump tanks and process officially begins for a team once they remove their weigh in bag/fish and

step away from the tournament boat. Once a team initiates the bump tank/weigh in process, that team may not alter, add, nor reduce their tournament bag and catch or return to their boat until their catch has been weighed and recorded.

If a team is in possession of more than five (5) fish in their tournament bag at any point of the official weigh in process, all weight will be lost for that competition day. This is regardless of where in the process the extra fish are discovered.

The official ruler will be "The Judge." Fish will be measured by a Tournament Official with fish's mouth closed and longest straight line. Only fish which measure the official length(s) shall be weighed. Any modification made to fish (clipping) in order to achieve a certain length may result in loss of that days weigh in totals and/or disqualification from the tournament. Teams may present up to five (5) fish of 14" minimum length to the bump tanks (number of fish and minimum length and/or other restrictions may be used and will be announced at the rules meeting per Section 12). Any fish presented for weigh-in which fails to measure the official length limits shall result in loss disqualification from event.

Teams will be allowed to weigh the five (5) fish presented and inspected at the bump tank and then may select one "Big Fish" from those five (5) to be weighed for the Big Fish Pot prizes. A team member must choose the fish to be weighed for the big fish prize with no input from the emcee, audience, or Tournament Officials/Volunteers. Once fish are weighed, there will be no re-weighing of fish. The weight on the scales stands. BCB does not require the live release of tournament fish and they may be kept for consumption or donation. If a "live" release process is created (on a per tournament basis), directions regarding that process will be provided prior to the tournament day.

19. TOURNAMENT BOAT BREAKDOWN INSTRUCTIONS:

All participants must remain together, leaving and returning to the official checkpoint by boat. All competitors must always remain in boat except in case of dire emergency if they wish their fish to be counted for the day.

In case of non-emergency event or break down (does not include running out of fuel), in which a team is not able to travel back to the weigh-in site under power, participants should contact the Tournament Director before taking any action.

The only permitted way to return for weigh-in without your own power is:

1.) By being towed in by a boat operated by another tournament competitor in the event or a designated rescue boat. Both boats must arrive by the whichever teams is the earliest designated return time.

2.) By one team member transferring their clearly marked fish to another tournament boat and proceeding directly to the weigh in. This process should include at minimum:

- Recorded or live video footage of entire marking and transfer process
- Both teams' individual fish clearly marked (E.g. in a separate weigh in bag or container, separate live-well with clearly identifiable cull tags)

Locating or flagging down another tournament boat for assistance via phone, messaging, or radio transmission in an effort to link up with a specific team is not allowed. Physically flagging down or an open radio call that was seeking help from any tournament boat in proximity to return to the weigh-in site is allowable. Neither tournament boat/team is permitted to fish after assisting, must proceed directly to weigh in site once boat is moored/trailer and all parties go directly to the Tournament Director.

Arriving late, because of offering or needing assistance due to a non-emergency breakdown, even with the aid of a rescue boat, as the towed boat or the towing boat is still late, and all penalties will apply. No exceptions.

Both parties (the team needing and team lending assistance) should immediately report to the Tournament Director upon arrival at weigh in. Any Team involved in a break down procedure that involves transferring fish between boats, may be polygraphed as necessary (Section 25) at the Tournament Officials sole discretion.

If the Tournament Director cannot be reached in the event of a breakdown, teams should take appropriate action to return boat and team safely to nearest port or the weigh in location. In event the above process cannot be followed, it will result in loss of days catch weight.

20. SCORING AND WEIGH IN:

Only eligible fish will be utilized for the purpose of scoring (See Section 12). Scoring shall be determined by the pound\ounce weight of each team's catch during the tournament. Each team's total weight will determine the final standings.

Teams must provide their own tournament style weigh in bag to transport fish to the bump tanks. Coolers, hand carrying, waste bags, etc. are not permitted to be used.

The weigh in process will begin with transportation of the fish from the boat utilizing a tournament style weigh in bag to the bump tanks near the weigh in. The bump tanks and process officially begins for a team once they remove their weigh in bag/fish and step away from the tournament boat. Once a team initiates the bump tank/weigh in process, that team may not alter, add, nor reduce their tournament bag and catch or return to their boat until their catch has been weighed and recorded.

If a team is in possession of more than five (5) fish in their tournament bag at any point of the official weigh in process, all weight will be lost for that competition day. This is regardless of where in the process the extra fish are discovered.

The official ruler will be "The Judge." Fish will be measured by a Tournament Official with fish's mouth closed and longest straight line. Only fish which measure the official length(s) shall be weighed. Any modification made to fish (clipping) in order to achieve a certain length may result in loss of that days weigh in totals and/or disqualification from the tournament. Teams may present up to five (5) fish of 14" minimum length to the bump tanks (number of fish and minimum length and/or other restrictions may be used and will be announced at the rules meeting per Section 12). Any fish presented for weigh-in which fails to measure the official length limits shall result in loss disqualification from event.

Teams will be allowed to weigh the five (5) fish presented and inspected at the bump tank and then may select one "Big Fish" from those five (5) to be weighed for the Big Fish Pot prizes. A team member must choose the fish to be weighed for the big fish prize with no input from the emcee, audience, or Tournament Officials/Volunteers. Once fish are weighed, there will be no re-weighing of fish. The weight on the scales stands. BCB does not require the live release of tournament fish and they may be kept for consumption or donation. If a "live" release process is created (on a per tournament basis), directions regarding that process will be provided prior to the tournament day.

21. VERIFICATION OF SCALES:

Prior to each day's weigh in, the following will be performed by the Tournament Director AND witnessed by a second Tournament Official.

The process for verification will be:

1. Weigh-in table will be verified for level in all directions. Adjustments made to have a level weigh in table.
2. Scale accuracy will be verified with an object of known weight and any needed scale adjustments made.
3. EACH official weigh-in basket (total of 8) will be verified on the scale to record

a “tare” weight of zero (0) lbs./oz.

4. ONE of the official weigh-in baskets will be designated as “Big Fish” basket for that tournament day.

22. TIES:

If a tie occurs at an event, Tie breakers are as follows:

1. Highest number of legal fish weighed
2. Heaviest single day catch

24. PROTEST AND PROCESS:

Tournament Officials, in their sole discretion, reserve the right to consider rule violations discovered, reported or not, at any time for any reason, by any persons, before or after a tournament has ended and assess penalties for any past or future event including denying entry to compete in future events.

It is the discretion of the Tournament Director whether to the listed procedure or require the team reporting the infraction to file an official protest per the MWT rules. In some cases, rules may be enforced with no formal written protest if adequate information is available.

Any team participant has a right to protest another team. To protest, the following process must be initiated within 30 minutes of the last flight check in time OR within 10 minutes of the last fish being weighed that day, whichever is latest. No protests will be accepted or considered after that time.

a. An official written protest with \$100 fee must be made with the Tournament Director. 16 Approved and Released: October 2023

I. (Note: the fee will be returned if the protest is found valid and a ruling is enforced.)

b. All evidence supporting the protest is provided to the Tournament Director (e.g., photos.).

c. A meeting of the Tournament Committee will be held as soon as possible (may be AFTER completion days weigh-in) to review.

d. Details of the infraction are presented and discussed.

e. Interviews with concerned parties or if required, truth verification testing may be conducted (if necessary) by the Tournament Committee before a final ruling will be made.

f. Tournament Committee votes and makes a recommendation to the Tournament Director.

g. Tournament Director reviews recommendation, decides and enforces final decision.

In the event rules infractions occurred a penalty of daily and/or tournament weight may be applied, and any cash, prizes and awards must be returned if so requested. If a protest is found valid, the disqualified party must pay all investigative costs if necessary.

25. OFFICIAL MEDIA PERSONNEL/FILMING:

Participants are required to comply with all requests (including but not limited to: video, still camera, access to boat and access to fishing area) made by official BCB media personnel for the purpose of gathering promotional coverage throughout events. Failure to accommodate the official BCB media personnel will result in disqualification of that event.

The BCB holds the content rights to all the media and photos captured at the

tournaments it owns and operates. The BCB will grant the following exceptions, including the content rights, to tournament participants to use video or still images, shot by the angler during a tournament, for promotional or marketing purposes on the Angler's website and in social media. Anglers may also send photos, videos and updates to their social media and tag Border City Bassmasters to connect with our followers.

The BCB does reserve the right to revoke these exceptions/rights and designate tournament related content the angler must remove if it is deemed to be inappropriate or in any way violates other BCB rules. Refusal to remove designated content will result in disqualification at all future BCB events
